### **Charity Events**

The children came to school on Friday 1st March dressed in their pyjamas, slippers and dressing gowns in order to support the charity 'The Great Tommy Sleep Out'. This charity raises funds for homeless veterans on behalf of the RBLI (Royal British Legion Industries). The High Sheriff of Kent, Nadra Ahmed CBE, who sits on the board of RBLI, came to school to thank the children on behalf of the charity, and also to let the children know more about the charity and her role as high sheriff. She wore her ceremonial gowns, and the children asked some very interesting and sensible questions. The school raised a total of £312.22, so we would like to thank you for your support for this worthwhile charity.







We are very grateful to Zoe Henderson, who gave her time once again to lead a fun-filled danceathon session on Wednesday 21st February. Many of us shimmied and wiggled to raise much needed funds for the PTA, and burn some calories at the same time. We raised a total of £140, which will go towards improving our playgrounds for the children. 

We are hoping that author and poet Sam Gayton, whose books include The Last Zoo and World Weavers, will be visiting us on Wednesday to work with Key Stage 2.



## **Wrap Around Care**

Our wrap around care offer has become very popular and we have a large number of families who use the facility. We have had to increase the number of staff we employ in order to maintain an appropriate pupil to staff ratio, so unfortunately we have had to raise the cost for the 3:30pm to 4:30pm session by £1 to £4.50. This is the first increase for some while, and all the other prices remain the same.

It is also really important that you let the office know in advance if a different adult is collecting you child from After School Club. If you change your requirements for After School Club from a late collection to an early collection, can you also please let the office know in advance to prevent the waste of food.

Finally, when dropping your children off at Breakfast Club, can you please park in the outer car park, as the inner car park is reserved for staff.





### **Diversity**

We have in the past invited members of our school community to come and speak to the children about their faith, and to share some of their practices and beliefs. We would like to ask again whether anyone is willing to do this in the future.

Our children are all very good at following our policies and codes of conduct, and we would just like to remind everyone of a few key points we have had to remind them about recently:


- ·Any child with shoulder length or longer hair must wear it tied back;

The National Trust have provided an assortment of saplings for our woodland adventure area. We are looking forward to seeing them grow and the children will learn about taking care of saplings at the same time.






#### PTA
