Cross Country Success

Following an impressive start to the Cross Country Series with many top three results and team first places, the cross country teams performed incredibly well in the final two events of the competition.



Race 3: Capstone

In the first week of Term 3, determined runners from Years 4, 5 and 6 took part in the third event of the Cross Country Series.

Several children were placed in the top three runners in their event. Mason, Year 6, and Logan, Year 5, ran incredibly well to both be placed first in their races. In the Year 4 events, Ellie came second in the girls' race with George finishing in third place in the boys' race. Every team was placed in the top three which was a fantastic achievement. The Year 6 boys' team again won the first place trophy; Year 4 boys and Year 5 girls were placed second with the remaining teams finishing in third place.

These results meant that it was all 'to play for' in the run up to the final event on 28th February. We entered this event in second place out of 11 teams.

Race 4: Medway Park

The final event of the Cross Country Series was held at Medway Park. This race started and finished on the track with several laps around it on the grass. It was the furthest of all four races.

Aware of the importance of the race in terms of overall positioning, every child ran their race with enthusiasm, resilience and the determination to perform as well as they could.

Again, we had runners placed in the top three in most of the races. Logan finished first in the Year 5 boys' race, George was second in the Year 4 boys' race and Lorelei, Year 4, and Conifer, Year 5, were placed third in their respective races.



The final race of the day was the Year 6 boys' race, which was an excellent display of courage, maturity and resilience. Favourite to win, Mason, comfortably led from the front and was closely followed by Fletcher and Heath. It was fantastic to watch all three sprint down the track to finish in first, second and third. This impressive win meant that the Year 6 boys' team picked up the first place trophy yet again! With three runners finishing in the top seven, the Year 4 girls also won the first place trophy. Finishing in second place were the Year 4 boys and both Year 5 teams with the Year 6 girls in third place.

Final Results:

Tension was growing as the results were being announced for the series. After the fantastic performances at Medway Park, everyone knew that the overall results would be very close and hoped that we had done enough to grasp the first place trophy. Awards were also rewarded for the top three individuals in each group; the top three teams and top girls and top boys team.

Mason's impressive victory in the Year 6 boys' race meant that he secured the top position in this age group. Logan and George came second in the Year 5 and 4 boys' races whilst Conifer achieved second place in the Year 5 girls and Lorelei was third in the Year 4 girls. Winning all their team races, the



Year 6 boys took the first place position in this event. The Year 4 girls' team also won their group.

Anticipation rose once it was announced that Cliffe Woods was placed second in both the Girls and Boys Team Shields. Overall, the team was narrowly beaten to second place in the Combined Team Award by only four points!

Awesome athletes

Budding athletes from Years 5 and 6 took part in a couple of Sportshall Athletics Competitions, which involved running, jumping and throwing events.

In the first event, held at Medway Park, the team finished in third place.

There were some fantastic individual performances. Several of our athletes finished in the top three positions. Logan S and Janet both jumped impressively in the standing long jump; Bethany B jumped over five metres in the standing



triple jump; Emerson was impressive in the vertical jump and Fletcher achieved seven metres in the chest push. The sprint teams of Emily and Janet and Fletcher and Ethan finished in second and third places and the boys relay were placed third.

A few weeks later, a team of athletes participated in a competition held at Mote Park. Overall, Cliffe Woods finished in second place, with both the girls and boys teams winning Silver medals.



Again, we had some impressive individual performances. Bethany B came first in the chest push and standing triple jump; Mason came first in the standing triple jump and speed bounce and Fletcher came first in the chest push.

Mia was second in the standing long jump with Emily and Ella Rae finishing third and fourth in the speed bounce. Heath was placed third in the standing triple jump and Willow B was fourth in the javelin. The majority of the running races were placed in the top three with Ethan and Fletcher winning their sprint race.

As much as we enjoy winning a trophy, sport is also about participation. By the end of Term 4, just over 75% of children in Year 6 will have competed in at least one sports event. By the end of the school year, every child in Year 6 who would like to compete will have done so.

The majority of our events are for children in Years 5 and 6 to participate in so it has been great that children from younger year groups have also been given the opportunity to represent the school in sport. This year we have participated in more events and extended these to the younger year groups to promote an enjoyment of sport; encourage participation and develop teamwork and resilience skills.

Mini Youth Games Table Tennis


