## Books



Diary of a Wimpy Kid or Dog-Man


Any of the Tree House stories

Wiggle Bottom Primary series


Information books about animals

As you will be aware from previous newsletters, as a school we have been working to complete the Equally Safe programme through the Equaliteach organisation. The aim of this is to continue to find ways to promote equality, tackle prejudice and educate young people about the harms of bullying. We want to ensure our pupils have the knowledge and confidence to feel empowered in calling out bullying and prejudice when they see it and become active citizens who work for change.

We wanted to share with you the feedback we recently received from the Equaliteach representative who came to deliver training at our school. She was so impressed with our Agents for Change initiatives and all the good things we have been doing in the school that she asked if they could use our school as a case study to showcase 'outstanding practice' on their website. Medway Music Association's FREE Weekly Online Music Tech Sessions run via Zoom on Tuesdays 16:30 – 17:30 during term time only.

These sessions are for pupils aged 9 - 18 (year 5 -year 13) and cater for complete beginners through to the more advanced.

These sessions will offer pupils the chance to work with an online Digital Audio Workstation - Bandlab. Pupils will learn how to create music electronically and production techniques such as looping, automation and sampling, as well as creating music for specific purposes, e.g. music for adverts, films etc.
